The Citrus County Pet Meals Program is supplemental to Meals on Wheels. Pet Meals started nearly 19 years ago when a very thin man receiving Meals on Wheels was only taking small bites of his food and then placing his food tray on the floor for a much beloved Chihuahua to finish his meal. When asked why he was doing this, he stated he did not have the money to buy dog food any longer and that he would rather go hungry than not feed his pet. Pet Meals is a 100 percent donation-based and volunteer driven program that provides dog/cat food to about 100 home bound seniors. Scholarship Committee News—Returning to College: A Very Difficult Decision

The CHWC Scholarship Committee held its organizational meeting for this year on Tuesday morning, October 18th. We were happy to welcome our two new members, Gail Bockiaro and Janice Clark.

One of our most rewarding accomplishments last year, as a Club and as members of the Scholarship Committee, was our ability to **award a \$1000 scholarship to Ms**. Beth Brown, (CCF) using the criteria now in place, which states that this college scholarship be awarded to "a woman who has a desire to return to school to continue her education after a lapse of time," often called a "non-traditional student."



Many of you may remember hearing **Beth speak at our February Luncheon**. She was truly amazing, and we are happy to report that she graduated from CCF in June, **2022 with her Associates' Degree and plans to complete her nursing degree next.**

The number of Americans who have some college credit, but have not completed a degree has been increasing over the past few years. **A July 2020 report from the** *Na*-

tional Student Clearinghouse showed that the number of students with some college, but no degree, had grown to 39 million Americans. 39 million people is about one out of every four adults in the United States.

Of even greater concern is that **this group grew by 9% between 2018 and 2020**, and many researchers fear that the impact of the pandemic will affect this trend even more negatively.

Students stop their college education for dozens of reasons, **most of which have very little to do with their inability to learn;** family life, accidents, illness, working full-time, finances, and so much more can make a student decide to take a break, usually planning on returning, but often not doing so.

What is this group left with? **College credits that count for very little, no credential that will lead to a well-paying job,** and most always, considerable debt for something that cannot help them to achieve a solid future, much less follow a dream.

Our goal with this scholarship is to help women of all ages and backgrounds re-claim their education, continue to learn new skills, remain agile and adaptable, become solid providers for themselves and their families, and perhaps, realize their dreams. By helping the people in our community to claim the power to face the future of work suc-



cessfully, we are contributing to the strength and productivity of our community.

With the help of the Educational Foundation at the College of Central Florida, we have chosen two women as our scholarship winners this fall, Ms. Jasmine Coatney and Ms. Angela Mulligan. In her thank you note to us, Jasmine said: "...I am forty -eight years old, from Citrus County, and a single mother of two daughters in college....Last fall I decided that there is no reason for me not to finish school now that my girls are away at

college. I work full time bar-tending, but my job closed three months ago for remodeling, so this scholarship means the world to me, and I am extremely grateful! My major is Business Administration.....My goals for the year are to complete my AA degree at the end of the fall semester and continue working toward my bachelor's degree. I would like to thank you again for choosing me to receive this scholarship!

Our second winner, Angela, wrote the following: ".... I am a divorced mother of two boys. In the spring of 2023, I plan to graduate with my AA degree and continue my education at UF in Gainesville, where I will pursue a BA in Psychology. My dream is to become a licensed clinical social worker and use that to be a counselor specializing in working with children.
