recorded background music tracks - the same digital music technology that the world's greatest singers today also utilize in their live acts.


Chance is known for his wide range and vocal imitative morphing skills in

The Citrus County Pet Meals Program is supplemental to Meals on Wheels. Pet Meals started nearly 19 years ago when a very thin man receiving Meals on Wheels was only taking small bites of his food and then placing his food tray on the floor for a much beloved Chihuahua to finish his meal. When asked why he was doing this, he stated he did not have the money to buy dog food any longer and that he would rather go hungry than not feed his pet. Pet Meals is a 100 percent donation-based and volunteer driven program that provides dog/cat food to about 100 home bound seniors. Food is not guaranteed and relies on the generosity of the community.

Pets are often the only consistent companion many seniors have and are often considered part of the family and pet food is a big expense.

Have you ever found yourself wondering how our Citrus County community can possibly use all the food that **CHWC collects at its luncheons every month**, or **the 500 pounds of pet food** we donated in just one month last year, or the hundreds of warm clothes that filled most of a large truck after our November luncheon?

As abundant as the donations sometimes appear, an article pub-



lished in the Citrus County Chronicle on December 22, 2022, written by Michael Bates, helped to clarify for me the enormity of need in our local environs. As you may have already read, Citrus County was ranked <u>#34</u> out of 67 Florida counties for the educational well-

being of our children, and **#30** for family and community wellbeing overall in a recent report issued by the Florida Policy Institute. **Data was collected** from the Florida Child Well-Being Index. The Institute developed the rankings using data from KIDS COUNT, a project of the nationwide Annie E. Casey Foundation.

The article describes the effort underway in the County, Prosperi-

ty Chain, "which seeks to break the chains of generational poverty by 2030." The most powerful way that we as caring, supportive citizens can break those chains is by investing in our children.

CHWC does this in many ways in addition to our collections of clothing, food, and supplies that families need for daily survival.





Why Scholarship? (continued)

We participate in the "Adopt A Child Program" at Christmas time to ensure that all needy children in our county are blessed with gifts from Santa. We support the Carter School, an important head start program, with our time, skill and donations of supplies. We contribute to several important local charity groups who provide necessary services and support to children and families so that they do not, for example, go hungry or suffer from abuse.

And we provide **scholarship funds to high school and college students** who need our support to continue their education. Research has long shown that **the single most powerful**





way to break generational

poverty is

through education. Whether it be a degree in molecular biology from UF or a certification in office management from WTC, the students pursuing these goals are taking the necessary steps to become productive citizens.

It will be through the hard work of these young people that our **County will be able to raise its rankings in the Florida Child Well-Being Index**. These young people will work hard and be able to support and educate their own children. They will lead happier and more fulfilling lives while building a stronger community.

And believe me, they will remember us, the people who have helped them **escape from generational poverty.** And they will smile when they read an article in the paper, several years from now, which states how Citrus County has worked hard to raise its rankings.
