When asked why he was doing this, he stated he did not have the money to buy dog food any longer and that he would rather go hungry than not feed his pet. Pet Meals is a 100 percent donationbased and volunteer driven program that provides dog/cat food to about 100 home bound seniors. Food is not guaranteed and relies on the generosity of the community.

Pets are often the only consistent companion many seniors have and are often considered part of the family and pet food is a big expense.
