high school students at our three county schools plus scholarships to the Withlacoochee Technical College and College of Central Florida. Creation of an emergency fund for future disasters in Citrus County.

All of our accomplishments are directly due to the **generosity of our members through our fundraisers**, monthly charity collections and charity drive - throughs .
