

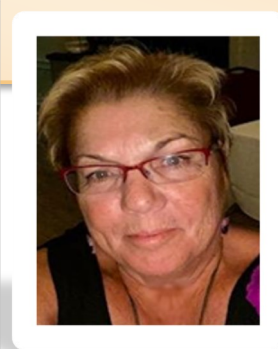

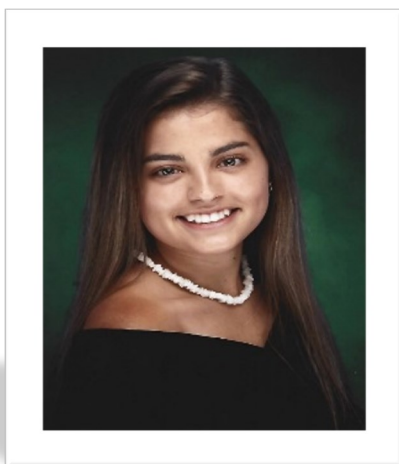

and Sybil Letzing, along with co-chairs Claire Lindley and Marcia Schenker. We want to thank both **Ina Herzer and Bette June Egan**, our outgoing members, for their excellent service over the last several years. Our first **meeting of the year will take place on October 18th**, when we will review our 2023 Scholarship Applications and organize our work for the year.

The **CHWC Scholarship Program funds high school seniors from Citrus and Lecanto High Schools with \$1000 each as they begin college**. Students may apply through their respective counseling offices by February 2023. The Scholarship Committee meets to evaluate each applicant based on set criteria including scholarship, leadership and financial need. Students are traditionally awarded their scholarships at the May luncheon.

One of our 2021 scholarship winners, **Samantha Prinner**, was gracious enough to send us an update on her college career at the beginning of her fall semester.

Please read an excerpt from her letter below:

I very much enjoy writing to you ladies my updates from college, as you are a big reason for my success here! Last fall I wrote that I was on track to receive my Bachelor's degree in 3 years, and my masters in 4. Due to taking college classes year round, I am now supposed to graduate in the summer with my Bachelor's degree, which is two years instead of three!

I would ultimately love to then complete my master's here starting next fall, but I have to see if I can save enough funds to help with the last year. I would like to get my master's because the graduate school of criminology is heavily focused on research with professors and the Dean of Criminology, where we can effectively evaluate programs implemented and policies passed by legislation, and their effect on the goal at hand (how cool!).



This semester, I am taking 18 credits, phew! However, it is so worth it as I love them all and it allows me to switch my focus to my full-time internship in the spring with the U.S. Secret Service. I cannot wait to update you, ladies, again in the spring on my internship. I am beyond excited to get an insight into working with federal agencies and become part of a team dedicated to making a difference every day. This has been such an exciting experience and I have made so many memories I hope to cherish for a while.

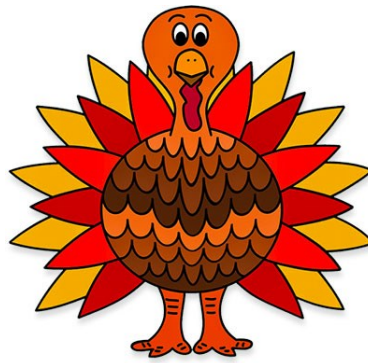
I hope you ladies are doing well, and I look forward to updating you again soon!

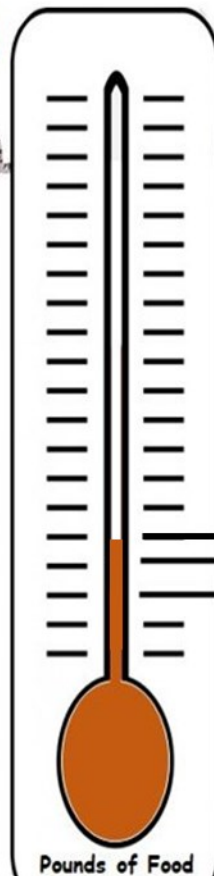


CHWC Paw Pantry Needs:

By donating to CHWC Paw Pantry program, **we can make a difference!** We will be having a special container at luncheons and/or at charity drive thru events to accept your generous donations. **Any brand of food is welcomed.**

The **Citrus County Pet Meals Program** is supplemental to Meals on Wheels. **Pet Meals started nearly 19 years ago** when a very thin man receiving Meals on Wheels was only taking small bites of his food and then placing his food tray on the floor for a **much beloved Chihuahua to finish his meal.** When asked why he was doing this, he stated he did not have the money to buy dog food any longer and that he would rather go hungry than not feed his pet. **Pet Meals is 100 percent donation-based and volunteer driven program that provides dog/cat food to about**

100 home bound seniors. Food is not guaranteed and relies on the generosity of the community. **Pets are often the only consistent companion** many seniors have and are often considered part of the family and pet food is a big expense.

Facts: I am a **military brat from two USAF Officers - a Pilot and a Nurse**. I was born in **Alaska**, but we didn't live there very long. We moved about every couple of years, and I was fortunate to live in the **Philippines at Clark AFB growing up**.

I was on the tarmac when the POWs came home from Vietnam. My dad was on the rescue and recovery operations and my mother was head nurse for one of the floors at the hospital. I was in the USAF Reserves as a Medical Service Corp Officer, and I was able to fly with the Air Evac Squadron. **My husband (Steve) and I met in the Officer's Club bar at Maxwell AFB**. He is retired USAF as a WISO and Ops Officer. One of our four children went into the military out of high school, the AZ Army Air Guard. He was sent to Afghanistan for a year as a flight operations specialist.



Children: His/Hers/Ours - Two sons from Steve, 38 and 35. The 38-year-old lives with us here while going through treatment for chronic Lyme disease and mold toxicity, and he works from home as a website designer. The youngest daughter is "ours" and is 23 years old. She currently lives and works in London.**

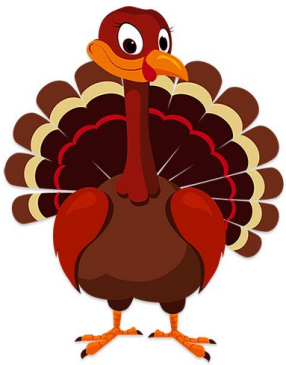

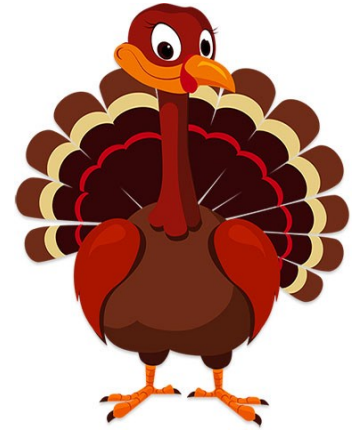
