Electronic Media: Bring your technology skills to bear. Do you have background working with maintaining web sites, web security, or electronic record storage? We'd love to hear from you.



We were extremely pleased by the number of applicants, as well as by their **competence**, **experience** and **passion** for **education** and **our local students**. After complet-



ing the interviewing process, we are happy to report that we have filled our vacancies with two very accomplished and skilled women, Gail Bockiaro and Janice Clark. Gail and Janice will join our sitting members, Nanette Mitchell, Jane Dempsey

and Sybil Letzing, along with co-chairs Claire Lindley and Marcia Schenker. We want to thank both Ina Herzer and Bette June Egan, our outgoing members, for their excellent service over the last several years. Our first meeting of the year will take place on October 18th, when we will review our 2023 Scholarship Applications and organize our work for the year.

The CHWC Scholarship Program funds high school seniors from Citrus and Lecanto High Schools with \$1000 each as they begin college. Students may apply

through their respective counseling offices by February 2023. The Scholarship Committee meets to evaluate each applicant based on set criteria including scholarship, leadership and financial need. Students are traditionally awarded their scholarships at the May luncheon.

One of our 2021 scholarship winners, **Samantha Prinner**, was gracious enough to send us an update on her college career at the beginning of her fall semester.

Please read an excerpt from her letter below:

I very much enjoy writing to you ladies my updates from college, as you are a big reason for my success here! Last fall I wrote that I was on track to receive my Bachelor's degree in 3 years, and my masters in 4. Due to taking college classes year round, I am now supposed to graduate in the summer with my Bachelor's degree, which is two years instead of three!

I would ultimately love to then complete my master's here starting next fall, but I have to see if I can save enough funds to help with the last year. This semester, I am taking 18 credits, phew! However, it is so worth it as I love them all and it allows me to switch my focus to my full-time internship in the spring with the U.S. Secret Service. This has been such an exciting experience and I have made so many memories I hope to cherish for a while.

I hope you ladies are doing well, and I look forward to updating you again soon!




February TBD – We will be bringing back the ever popular **Aprons Cooking School**. Check the website for updates as details become available.






By donating to CHWC Paw Pantry program, we can make a difference! We will be having a special container at luncheons and/or at charity drive thru events to accept your generous donations. Any brand of food is welcomed.

The Citrus County Pet Meals Program is supplemental to Meals on Wheels. Pet Meals started nearly 19 years ago when a very thin man receiving Meals on Wheels was only taking small bites of his food and then placing his food tray on the floor for a much beloved Chihuahua to finish his meal. When asked why he was doing this, he stated he did not have the money to buy dog food any longer and that he would rather go hungry than not feed his pet. Pet Meals is 100 percent donation-based and volunteer driven program that provides dog/cat food to about



100 home bound seniors. Food is not guaranteed and relies on the generosity of the community. Pets are often the only consistent companion many seniors have and are often considered part of the family and pet food is a big expense.

Facts: I am a military brat from two USAF Officers - a Pilot and a Nurse. I was born in Alaska, but we didn't live there very long. We moved about every couple of years, and I was fortunate to live in the Philippines at Clark AFB growing up.

I was on the tarmac when the POWs came home from Vietnam. My dad was on the rescue and recovery operations and my mother was head nurse for one of the floors at the hospital. We looked around and settled on Citrus Hills, started building in April 2021 and moved into our home in Griffin View in late Feb 2022. We love the neighborhood, the people and the projected growth of the area. We especially love the trees and nature preserves in Citrus and surrounding counties.

Steve and I are active with favorite activities being hiking (him), biking, camping, snow skiing, scuba diving, and traveling in general. One of my favorite activities is playing Maj Jongg using the Wright Patterson rules. This is a more Asian inspired form of Maj Jongg that is played at military bases around the world. We are both looking forward to getting involved in the many sports and activities available. I enjoy working out at Bella Vita, playing golf, and pickle ball.

I'd provide his food for the trail and pick him up every so often to let him get a shower and sleep in a nice bed, then take him back to the trail the next morning. 
