- **1988 Directory (94 Members)** ... "This club is a social organization established in 1986 for the purpose of further acquaintanceship and friendly relations among the female residents of Citrus Hills."
- 2022-23 Handbook (~320 Members) ..."Our Club was established in 1986 and is dedicated to charitable efforts throughout Citrus County and to educational programs. Members work together in a spirit of friendship for the betterment of the community and to help each other. CHWC is a 501(c)(3) organization."

Another great artifact found was a presentation entitled, "<u>Citrus Hills Women's Club – 30 Years</u> <u>Strong</u>!," which represents how the organization has evolved over 30 years (through 2016). Below is just a sampling of the presentation highlights that were interesting.

- **1986:** Luncheon Meetings held in homes of members; **1990** moved to the Hampton Room.
- 1987-89: Began publishing Membership Directory and Newsletter
- 1991-93: First Fashion Show; Craft & Bake Sale added as a fundraiser
- **1997-99**: Scholarship Committee established; Ways & Means Chair added.
- 2004-05: Activities Committee formed with emphasis on outside day trips.
- 2006-10: Developed website; Victorian Tea & Annual Mistletoe Ball
- **2011-16:** Website expanded; Newsletter available digitally; Mardi Gras themed Fashion Show most profitable fundraiser to-date

October 2022 Luncheon Speaker

Community Crimes Detectives Joshua Cutlip and Kyle Helfritz will be the speakers at the October CHWC meeting. Their focus will be on Crime Prevention, steps to take to **avoid becoming a victim, and discussion on scams.**

The mission of the Citrus County Sheriff's Office Crime Prevention team is to create an active and involved partnership to educate and provide resources to assist in keeping our community, families, and businesses safe.

Crime Prevention is the anticipation, recognition, and appraisal of a crime risk, and the initiation of action to remove or reduce it. Crime Prevention is an active approach utilizing public awareness and preventive measures to reduce crime.

Some things to keep an eye out for include:

- Someone running from a car, home, or business.
- Excessive traffic to and from a specific residence, especially during unusual hours.
- An individual screaming or an alarm going off.
- A person who has no purpose or is wandering the area.
- Strangers offering services or products for an extremely low price.
- Abandoned property.
- Motorists stopped to talk to a child who is visibly uncomfortable or is resisting.






munity. **Pets are often the only consistent companion** many seniors have and are often considered part of the family and pet food is a big expense.




