The CHWC would like to thank **Dalia Halpern** for creating and writing **"In the Spotlight" for 5 years**. Dalia's articles every month presented the membership with



Facts: I was born and raised in Wisconsin. I graduated from the University of Wisconsin with a degree in accounting and a minor in computers. I began working in finance with an insurance agency. A few years into the job in 1989, I figured I could do the same thing and started my own Insurance agency and Finance company in Forest Park, IL. I like to think that I was successful in pioneering women-

**owned businesses in the insurance industry.** I sold the business after almost 10 years. I wanted to try something fun and stress-free, so I took on a **job as a stretch limousine driver in Chicago**. This job was anything but dull. I got to meet many VIPs.

After a few years, I decided to go back to corporate America and took a job with Incredible Technologies, a video game manufacturer. My interest in golf started there, playing Golden Tee Golf. This was a coin-operated video console where you could experience the game by playing and competing with others from around the world. At one point I was ranked as one of the top 5 women Golden Tee golfers in the world. My children loved coming to work on their days off from school because they could play all kinds of video games for free. I also worked for a high-performance sailboat manufacturer. This is where I learned to sail and ice boat. Ice-boating is sailing on frozen lakes where you can exceed speeds of 100 mph. When I remarried, I moved to Central Illinois. I tried to find an accounting position with a manufacturing firm. While unsuccessful in my hunt, I kept hearing an ad for a DJ at the local radio station. I applied and became the morning DJ at WGFA; (W)orlds (G)reatest (F)arming (A)rea. I could only squeeze about 5 or 6 songs in an hour as I was busy giving out rain gauge reports, soil temperature readings, Farmer's Almanac reports etc.

I met my 2<sup>nd</sup> husband, Jerry, on the air through ham radio. I was asked to co-host a weekly show called Ham Nation. I also got involved in the public service aspect of ham radio via emergency communica-

tions. In 2017 when hurricane Maria struck Puerto Rico, I along with 19 other hams were selected out of hundreds of volunteers to provide emergency communication under the auspices of the Red Cross. We were on the first plane into Puerto Rico after the hurricane. When we arrived, we were the only island-wide communication on the island. Our services were in high demand. I was stationed at the emergency operations center in San Juan with all the other disaster agency heads. The other 19 (male) hams were scattered throughout the island at various hospitals still in operation and the dam that was in fear of breaching. They would call me on the ham radio for evacuations, oxygen tanks, medicine, and other emergency needs. I would run around and find the agency that could get them what they needed.

A month before hurricane Maria, my son and I traveled to Texas to rescue drowning dogs and cats from the devastating floods from hurricane Harvey. Because of all my public service in the hobby, I won HAM of the year in 2018. I was in the company of prior nominees and award winners like Walter Cronkite, Nobel prize laureates and astronauts. My call sign is NV9L.

We love Florida and purchased our second home in Presidential Estates, but we're not quite ready for retirement. We still own an 80-acre farm in Illinois that produces corn, soybeans, and alfalfa....and live there during the summer months. When I am here, I play golf, and have many varied interests. I've taken 2 kitchens and 3 bathrooms to the studs and fully remodeled them. The hardest part of remodeling right now is that my mind still thinks I'm young, but my body keeps telling me otherwise. I also love to cook and bake. One of my newest passions is art. I enjoy tapping into my creative side, especially after being in insurance and accounting for 40 plus years. I am pictured with my newest project where I created a piece of art as my sliding door to our bathroom...after installing a header above.

Open Secret: My first marriage was to a professional guitar player. He gave me 2 beautiful children. His band was on Atlantic records and made the billboard charts back in the 80s. They opened for many famous bands and musicians. It was fun touring and hanging out with the likes of Lynyrd Skynyrd, The Bangles, Peter Frampton, Joan Jett, Cheap Trick, and so many others.



She was also a member of the Cross-country team, the National Honor Society, Phi Theta Kappa, Interact Club, Link Crew, and the Crystal River High Health Occupations Students of America. 

# **Pets Need Our Help**




By donating to the CHWC Paw Pantry program, we can make a difference in the lives of over 100 homebound seniors' with pets.
