Facts: I was born and raised in California. I put myself through college and graduated from UCLA with a bachelor's degree in public administration and minor in Political Science. I worked for two years at the County Chief Admin office. In 1971 I had been the first woman that they had ever placed in their management trainee program. Their primary focus of the job was budget management. I enrolled for a master's in public administration public service from USC. I met and married my husband Al and had the good fortune to relocate to the new hot spot of the United States at the time, Seattle, Washington. We bought a house in a

Our boldest move as travelers was a 78-day cruise covering the entire Pacific Rim. We travelled mostly to Europe and Africa. We visited South Africa, Morocco, Kenya, Italy, Spain, France, Portugal, Austria, Germany and Scandinavia. My husband had been interested in Citrus Hills through pamphlets and "leave behinds" that he had picked up along the way. Being from the West Coast, the Florida plan wasn't too encouraging because it was a far move from our family and our original home states. However, on a trip to see my son's and his family in the cusp of the Covid breakout, we had to re-route our trip and my husband thought it would be a good idea to take the opportunity to visit Citrus Hills. We did and we loved it and now we are here. Still love it. There are so many things to do and it is so beautiful. My husband and I play golf and we enjoy the amenities. I am excited to meet new people through the CHWC and learn more about their functions, trips, events and fundraisers.
