Presides at meetings in the absence of the President, serves on the Finance Advisory Committee and performs additional duties as designated by the President. (Jan Rudin and Elizabeth D'Andrea are the current co-1st, Vice Presidents.)

Treasurer: Collects the **CHWC membership dues**, pays approved expenses, and keeps a full and accurate account of all transactions; and recognizes donations according to 501(c) (3) regulations. Prepares the financial records and submits the annual federal and state corporate filings and arranges for an annual review of the CHWC's financial records. The Treasurer chairs the Finance Advisory Committee. **(Diane Edwards and Denise Uva are the current co-Treasurers.)**

Secretary: Records and distributes the minutes of Board meetings, and of the annual Member meeting; and keeps the corporate records and correspondence of the CHWC as indicated. Presides at meetings in the absence of the President and the Vice Presidents. (Claire Lindley and Marcia Schenker are the current co-Secretaries.)

There's no better way to **influence change and future improvement** than to get involved! Together, we can make a difference! Facts: I'm from Cleveland, Ohio. I have been an educator a total of 50 years; thirty in Cleveland and twenty in Florida. I hold a master's degree in Reading and a Doctorate in Education Curriculum from the University of Akron. My career has spanned from classroom teacher to Assistant Principal to an administrator in Vocational Education. I am a member of Delta Kappa Gamma, an organization of active and retired teachers. I am a member of Take Stock in Children.

During my time in Ohio, my husband and I traveled with the **Singing Angels Children's Choir on trips outside the United States**. We visited **Poland, Germany, the Netherlands, Norway, Finland, Estonia, China and Italy.** Of all those places, I enjoyed China the most. The people were very courteous and ensured that we were comfortable and made our stay a delightful experience. **After 30 years, we retired and moved to Florida.**

Shortly after moving here, a neighbor suggested I could teach here at the college level. I began **teaching at St. Leo and served as the Department Chair of the Department of Education and a student advisor.** Additionally, I taught education courses to student teachers at the College of Central Florida and observed student teachers in

schools in Inverness and Ocala. For the past 9 years, I served as a legal professional guardian. In this capacity I assisted elderly citizens who could not take care of themselves, making sure they were in a safe environment, that their finances were secured and that they had a good quality of life. I am also a Reading Pal, a program sponsored by the United Way, where I read to children who are under 4 years of age at the Hernando Elementary School in the Pre-K program. I have also been past President of the Central Citrus Rotary and recently transferred to the Rotary Club of Inverness. At Good Shepherd Lutheran Church, I serve as the Chairperson of Social Ministry and a member of the council.

My husband and I traveled to Alaska and Ireland during our retirement and took 18 cruises on various Cruise Lines to the Western, Southern and Eastern Caribbean. We visited Cozumel, Jamaica, St. Kitts and Barbados. We also traveled in Europe on three Viking cruises.

I became a member of the **Citrus Hills Women's Club**, an organization I admire for their commitment to fundraising and donating money to worthy causes such as student scholarships and food and clothing drives for CASA and other organizations that serve people in need. In this organization, I **founded a book club**, **served on the publicity committee and worked with a team to develop fashion shows to raise funds.**


