Guest Luncheon Speaker: Cindi Fein, Executive Director at NAMI Citrus - National Alliance on Mental Illness

Millions of Americans quietly battle mental health issues. In fact, one in five US adults experience mental illness each year and many do not seek treatment for mental illness due to the associated stigma.

For many who are thinking about retirement or have recently retired, this is supposed to be the most magical years of your life, promising exciting travel and bucket list experiences. You've worked hard for so many years to reach this point, and now you have the opportunity to relax and enjoy



your time with family and friends. Unfortunately, for many older adults, they don't feel so optimistic after retirement. In fact, retirement can bring about **significant mental health issues**, including **depression and anxiety**. Often, there is a loss of identity, lack of a family support system, feelings of social isolation, lack of routine, financial challenges, physical health decline, and fear of aging. **Even worse, the loss of a significant partner to enjoy your retirement years can be devastating.**

Facts: I was born in northern New Jersey to a family that dates back prior to the Revolutionary War and am a member of the DAR. We have family ties back to the Mayflower. One special experience I had in the **Philippines was eating Balut** as part of a teambuilding event. Balut is a fertilized duck egg which is consumed while **the duck is in various stages of development**. Watch out for feathers and beaks! It was suggested by a coworker that I eat it in the dark.

After 7 years, I was transferred to a **division in Clearwater where we lived for 5 years.** We moved to Citrus Hills where I could continue to work remotely at the time of the pandemic; I retired in 2021. **I joined the CHWC and work as a volunteer on the Scholarship Committee and I also help with Mah Jongg tournaments and bake sales**. I golf with my husband as well as with friends and in leagues. **Russ and I are avid cooks** and we're always looking for new ingredients and interesting recipes to try. We love to go hiking and are fascinated by our observations of nature in the nearby preserves. 

We had only **one opening to replace our hard-working past Co-Chair, Claire Lindley.** We were extremely pleased by the number of applicants, as well as by their competence, experience and passion for education and our local students. After completing the interviewing process, we are happy to report that we have filled the vacancy with a very accomplished woman, **long-time CHWC member, Henny Feldberg. Henny will join our sitting**

members Jane Dempsey, Sybil Letzing, Gail Bockario, and Janice Clark, along with co-chairs Marcia Schenker and Nanette Mitchell.

We want to thank Claire for her tireless service to the community for the past several years. We all will try to emulate her passion for Citrus County students as we continue the work of our committee. Our first meeting of the year will take place on October 27th, when we will review our 2024 Scholarship applications and organize our work for the year.

The CHWC has been able to increase its generosity over the past few years to include scholarships to local college students in addition to the traditional high school students we have honored for many years. We look for "non-traditional" students who are studying to be able to give back something important to the community. Last spring, we were pleased to award \$1000 scholarships to two such students from Withlacoochee Technical College whose lives took a "different path." They were John Michniewicz and Kielden Cundiff.

John, 42, had earned a BS in Informational Systems in 2004 before his father fell ill and he became his caretaker for close to 20 years. He recently decided to go back to school and completed the entire WTC course work in his field of technology, which led him finally to Applied Cyber Security. At the time of the meeting, having completed an internship for the Citrus County School Board, John was in the "on-boarding" process with the Marion County Sheriff's Office for a position in Cyber-Security.



The creation of **Let's Try It Out (LTIO) activities** in 2022 gave members the opportunity to explore a variety of activities ranging from flower picking to movies to horseback riding and more. Since the start of the CHWC year in May, we've picked flowers, harvested blueberries, gone to movies together, made cards for the Sunshine Committee, and laughed through Bunco Happy Hour. What we learned is that our members find these smaller group activities a great way to meet new people who share their interests. Rather than shouting across a table to introduce yourself or trying to hold a conversation over the clatter of silverware, participants in LTIO activities provide a great starting point to make new acquaintances and try new things. **We especially encourage new members to join in.**

Talent is never required but we love enthusiasm. To meet members' interests, we created a monthly **cardmaking group**. We've added a **workshop for more advanced Mah Jongg** players in addition to our twice-yearly beginner classes. **Bunco Happy Hour** is now a regular monthly event. In response to a member's request, we are organizing a "Learn to Play **Bridge**" series. *Most exciting of all is that each of these groups is led by members of CHWC who are willing to share their time and talent with other members*.

In 2023-24 we are focused on providing additional opportunities for members to experience new things. Three workshops are planned to get you ready for the holidays: Easy Elegant Appetizers, Making a Holiday Wreath, and Creating a Distinctive Centerpiece in November. December's schedule includes gift wrapping at the Resource Center in support of Adopt a Child. In January we'll have a special activity in support of the February Fashion Show.

In February, we'll head to the Annual Beth Rose Polo Match (2/10). March is a repeat of the 9-hole golf fun round at Black Diamond (3/18). And these are just the start.

What about bus trips, you ask? The rising price of fuel has increased the costs of our trips. Related costs for tickets and food also have impacted pricing. Prior to COVID bus trips generally sold out. During the past year we had far fewer participants. We adjusted to the reduced demand by using a smaller bus and opening seats to "friends and family". Because of these challenges, bus trips won't begin until November when many of the snowbirds will have returned. We hope to have the line-up finalized by the October luncheon. Fortunately, several members have stepped up to the challenge to leading a trip so there will be a substitute for the Aprons trip in January as well as one to the Kennedy Space Center in 2024. Stay tuned.




