CHWC Luncheon Survey

We extend our sincerest gratitude to members who took time from their busy schedules to complete the CHWC Lunch-

eon Survey. We are pleased to report that 154 members promptly completed the survey for leadership review. We want you to know that we value the information received as it truly does help to determine what we are doing well and what we need to improve in order for your luncheon experience to be the best it can be.

There was a great deal of feedback from survey responses and we wanted to reach back out to inform you of various areas we will address over the course of the 2023-2024 club calendar. If you see something in our overview and would like to know more about that topic, please feel free to contact Pat Crawley or Elizabeth Gannon. In addition, we continue to welcome speaker/ entertainment suggestions.

Seating Arrangements: We have found that nearly 70% of CHWC members request to sit with friends when making their luncheon reservations. In fact, 93.5% of survey respondents indicated that social engagement is a priority. Several respondents indicated that they joined the club to meet new neighbors and that they find the seating arrangements to be pre-arranged, which defeats their purpose of finding new friends.

We will continue to allow members to fill tables with friends, however, we will also make every attempt to place single reservations at a table where there are open seats. Also, new members attending their first luncheon will be seated together with one or two CHWC Board members to facilitate a meet and greet.

In addition, seating assignments are tracked and we make every effort to avoid repeating a table assignment. We will continue the practice of rotating seating throughout the room. If you require special seating, please let us know in advance and we will accommodate your needs.

- **Meal Options:** The majority of respondents indicated a need for change concerning menu options and quality of food. We understand your concerns and have made adjustments to food options, beginning in September, within the club's budget and also available through the Grille's catering menu. For example, we plan to offer more "Lite Fare" menu options such as a sandwich with salad/soup. In addition, we are sharing survey results with Grille management and will work very hard to make bigger changes for the January through May 2024 meetings.
- **Speakers:** We received a variety of preferences for monthly speakers/entertainment. There was not one area that stood out from the others. One thing is clear and that is we will work hard to ensure that we have dynamic topics along with strong and entertaining speakers. We will also work, hard within our budget, to secure speakers in the areas of Travel; Citrus County Natural Resources/ Parks; and Health/Fitness. We continue to welcome member ideas and contributions to this process. We know that we have many accomplished and educated neighbors within our reach and we need members to help share their talents and stories!
- **Luncheon Timeframe:** We consistently look for ways to balance the business portion of meetings with socialization. This year, we plan to utilize the club's projector to display meeting information, and will refine this approach as we move forward. We will continue to include key club information in the monthly newsletter and any critical business that must be addressed with all members.

Introducing Dr. Delphina Hopkins-Gillispie

Dr. Delphina Hopkins-Gillispie, known as Del, has been a member of the Citrus Hills community since December 2021 and she joined the Citrus Hills Women's Club in May 2022. Originally from Greenville, South Carolina, Dr. Hopkins-Gillispie embarked on a remarkable educational journey in the field of sciences. She holds a bachelor's degree in biology from Berea College and a Master of Science degree in Biological Sciences/ Microbiology from the University of Kentucky/Eastern Kentucky University. Driven by an unwavering fascination with the mysteries of life, she began her career as a microbiolog-



ical analyst and lab coordinator at the USDA Forest Service before focusing her research on neonatal-perinatal medicine at the University of Kentucky Medical Center.

Dr. Hopkins-Gillispie's deep-rooted passion for working with young adults and education led her down a different path. In 1994, she obtained a **teaching license in secondary science education and subsequently earned her Ph.D. in curriculum and instruction from Purdue University.** Throughout her career, she conducted research in the sciences and education, published numerous articles, and spent many rewarding years as a professor. Dr. Hopkins-Gillispie specialized in **teaching human anatomy and physiology to nursing and pre-medical students**. At Valparaiso University, she held several leadership positions, including directorship of the Teacher Licensure Program, the Woodrow Wilson Teaching Fellowship Program, and the Mathematics, Science, Engineering, and Education (MSEED) Program.

Del's dedication to social justice and her commitment to promoting multiculturalism and diversity have earned her significant recognition. She received the Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Award in 2011, the Diversity Award in 2013, and the I -ATE (Indiana Association of Teacher Education) Award in 2016, highlighting her profound impact in these areas. Additionally, she co-founded the Peace and Justice Symposium, at Valparaiso University, a platform that fosters dialogue and drives positive change. Dr. Hopkins-Gillispie takes considerable pride in the Study Buddy Tutoring & Mentoring Program she initiated, as well as her work with homeless families in Northwest Indiana communities and her collaborations with students, teachers, and administrators in Gary, Indiana, community schools and surrounding areas.

Among the numerous highlights of her career, Dr. Hopkins-Gillispie's receipt of a \$500,000 NSF (National Science Foundation) grant, alongside two colleagues, stands out. This grant was dedicated to addressing the critical shortage of mathematics and science teachers, a pressing need within the field. After retiring as a tenured Professor in Biology and Education from Valparaiso University in 2016, she left behind an enduring legacy.

Outside of her professional pursuits, Del treasures her 48-year marriage to her husband, Charley, and their two lovely children. In December 2021, they made the decision to relocate to Citrus County, fully immersing themselves in the community's vibrant tapestry. Embracing the art of cooking, with a particular passion for baking, they have delighted their relatives and friends with delectable home-baked cakes, banana pudding, peach cobblers, and other delicious desserts. Within Citrus Hills, Del serves as the President of the Citrus Hills Garden Club and actively participates in several other community groups. **She has also assumed the role of chair for the 2024 Citrus Hills Women's Club Fashion Show.**

An intriguing facet of Dr. Hopkins-Gillispie's life is her love for adventure. Having experienced **the thrill of zip-lining in five different countries**, she finds solace and a sense of liberation amidst the enchanting fauna and flora of rainforests.

Dr. Hopkins-Gillispie envisions a **world devoid of prejudice**, **injustices**, **poverty**, **and hunger**. Her ardent desire is for all individuals to coexist harmoniously, and she eagerly looks forward to continuing her dedicated work toward realizing this vision.



What's in store for Activities in 2023-24?

A continued push to bring activities and trips that will enable members to get to know each other better and make new acquaintances who might become friends.
