

The Scholarship Committee has been hard at work this past month. We are very excited to announce that the CHWC Board approved a motion proposed by the Committee to include Crystal River High School in our scholarship program, beginning in the spring of 2024. All Board members were very supportive of this important change. Co-Chairs Marcia Schenker and Nanette Mitchell met with Kim Stratton, the scholarship coordinator at Crystal River High School in late November, who was delighted to welcome our organization into their school. She explained to us that the school has a four-year Health Academy, offering programs in biomedical, ENT, and dental, and has strong bonds with the College of Central Florida and Withlacoochee Technical College. They also have students taking AP courses and enrolled in the Dual Enrollment program at CCF.

Additionally, the co-chairs met with the guidance counselors **who coordinate the scholarship programs at Lecanto High School and Citrus High School**, Beth Evans and Callie McClain, respectively. We learned even more about each school and were invited to their Scholarship Nights in the spring of 2024.

On December 5th, Nanette and Marcia went to a meeting at WTC, where we met with our two young \$1000 scholarship winners and two school administrators, Mr. David Roland, WTC Director, and Ms. Diana Cooper, Financial Aid Specialist. We were overjoyed to meet the two young men, Tim Dottillis and Andrew Annand, and they were gracious and generous with their time and comments.


Scholarship Committee News *

We learned that **Tim (26) was born in Inverness and grew up in Crystal River, graduating from high school there in 2015.** He immediately joined the Navy and stayed in the service for six and a half years, working at the **Seattle-Kitsap-Bangor Naval-Submarine Base.** Tim worked in nuclear weapons security while there, serving in the harbor security patrol, the last line of defense for submarines and nuclear weapons. Tim

was also stationed at Key West for a while. He began his education at WTC in the welding program, but then switched to technology support. He uses funds from the Montgomery GI Bill to help with living expenses and was thrilled to get support from CHWC for his tuition.

Our second winner, Andrew (27), was born in Brooklyn, NY, and grew up in Queens, NY. He moved to Florida three years ago to help his Dad with his business, the Crystal River Motel, on Route 19 in Crystal River, and is still working there while in school. While in New York he did auto-motive body and mechanic work, but he always had an interest in the CISCO program, an introduction to networking, when he was young.

Both students are now involved in a very strenuous course of study, which will allow them to work in the world of cyber-security when they graduate. They both have several certificates, including an A+ certificate in general hardware and software technology, and PC Pro, but this term they are working to earn the Security + and Security Pro certifi-

cates, which will allow them to work at a bank, a big organization like a university in the cybercrimes division, (Tim's goal) or a large corporation like Amazon or Google, (Andrew's goal). They are full time students who need to put in 600 hours to become cyber-security specialists and then another 150 hours to take and pass a series of penetration tests.

Tim expressed that he would like to stay in Florida and work for UF in Gainesville, or the Tampa Bay Rays or Tampa Bay Lightning. Andrew is willing to move if he gets a good offer! Both men have used A-I in their work and are looking forward to learning more about it in the future.




